SNOW FALLING ON CEDARS - by: David Guterson
(1995 winner of the PEN/Faulkner Award) -has been made into a movie

I read this novel in 1995 shortly after it was published and decided to re-read it for LOL suggested reading. If you have not already read this book I hope you will consider reading it now as it a very moving story one you soon won't forget. . .

The story is based on the petty prejudices and moral ambiguity between the Japanese-Americans and the other citizen of 1950s Puget Sound, Washington. It tells an important part of our country's history, about the internment of Japanese-Americans during World War II. The actual story is about the death of a German fisherman, Carl Heine, and Kabuo Miyamoto, who too is a fisherman, and accused of killing Carl over a dispute about ownership of land. A riveting book that is hard to put down once you begin to read it.

What's God Doing? - by Pastor Dave

I remember reading an issue of *The Lutheran* when I came across an article that really stunned me. It was written by Dr. Kenneth Haugk. I worked for him and I worked with him, and I got to know him and his wife and his little girl. That was a few years ago when I was in the Seminary. I was startled to read the article,

So what do I know? and learned for the first time about the death of his wife, Joan. But what he writes is important for all of us to hear.

Kenneth Haugk writes, “In my life I have come to know many things. But five years ago much of what I know was significantly challenged. On January 19, 2002, Joan – my wife of 33 years, four months, 19 days,

three hours and 37 minutes – died after a three-year war with ovarian cancer.

When I think about that, I ask myself, ‘So what do I know?’

Just about the only thing I really know for sure is that Jesus loves me. Jesus loves me. Period.”

(What is God Doing? cont.)

I have been listening to many of you who have been going through difficult times. Here's a big question. What is God doing when you are in a bind? When the last penny is gone before the last bill is paid? When loved ones we have cherished are no longer with us to hold and to care for? What is God doing?

I know what many of *us* are doing. We are biting our nails, pacing the floors, taking pills. I know what we do. But what does God do?

We often look at Lent as a time of sadness and sorrow. After all, Jesus did suffer and die. He was scourged and beaten. We see him miserable and in misery. We hurt because we know that what we see is because of us, and that is true. But let me remind you, Jesus' life and death were for a cause – **YOU.**"

As we journey through our Lenten season, we are reminded that Jesus was all alone many times in His life, and even on the cross He asked, "Father, where are you?" What our journey also reminds us is that Jesus didn't do this just to go through what we live out in our lives. He lived his life and suffered his death that we would know the most important answer to our nagging question. So what is God doing?

Lent reminds us of the truth to that answer. He is doing what He always does.

He loves us. Yes, God loves us. Period.

Caring & Sharing Procedures

These procedures apply to current and past members of our congregation and their immediate family including parents, children, and their spouse if there is a death in the family. If there is a long-term illness, new baby or need for Stephen Ministers, At-Home Meal Ministry, Prayer Chain or any other ministry at Lord of Life Lutheran Church these procedures will also apply to members of LOLLC.

Initial contact is with the Office Administrator.

In the case of a death:

1. Office Administrator, at a minimum, gets the following information:

- Name of deceased
- Relationship with church member, if not a church member
- Name of the funeral home handling arrangements

Office Administrator contacts the Pastor and the Prayer Chain Coordinator with this information.

2. Prayer Chain Coordinator contacts the funeral home to get the following information:

- Verify name of deceased
- Date of death
- Visitation
- Funeral service
- Burial
- Memorials
- Survivors
- Address for condolences (may also get from church directory)

Prayer Chain Coordinator writes up a Caring & Sharing email (example below) and sends to the Email Coordinator and the Office Administrator. Prayer Chain Coordinator also notifies the Prayer Chain.

3. Email Coordinator sends the email to congregation.

4. Office Administrator contacts the Fellowship Chair and the person who purchases greeting cards for the congregation.

5. The Fellowship Chair contacts the family to offer to provide food after the funeral service and meals for the family. If the family would like meals in the week(s) following the funeral, the Fellowship Chair will provide this information to the At-Home Meal Ministry Chair.

6. A greeting card is purchased and placed in the narthex for the congregation to sign the following Sunday. For extended family members (grandparents, siblings, etc.), a card will be purchased for the congregation as appropriate.

In the case of a long-term illness, new baby or if a member requests meals:

The Fellowship Chair or Office Administrator will contact the At-Home Meal Ministry Chair.

Sample email for death notice (where Jill is a member; Jack is not):

We have been informed of the death of Jack Hill, father of Jill Valley, on Thursday, October 20, 2010.

Funeral arrangements are being handled by Cook Walden Funeral Home, 1234 N. Lamar, Austin, TX 512-000-0000.

Visitation will be held on Monday, October 24, from 6:00 – 8:00 PM. Funeral services will be held on Tuesday, October 25, and 10:00 AM at Cook Walden. Burial will be at the Evergreen Cemetery immediately following the services. A reception for family and friends will be held at Lord of Life Lutheran Church beginning at 12:00.

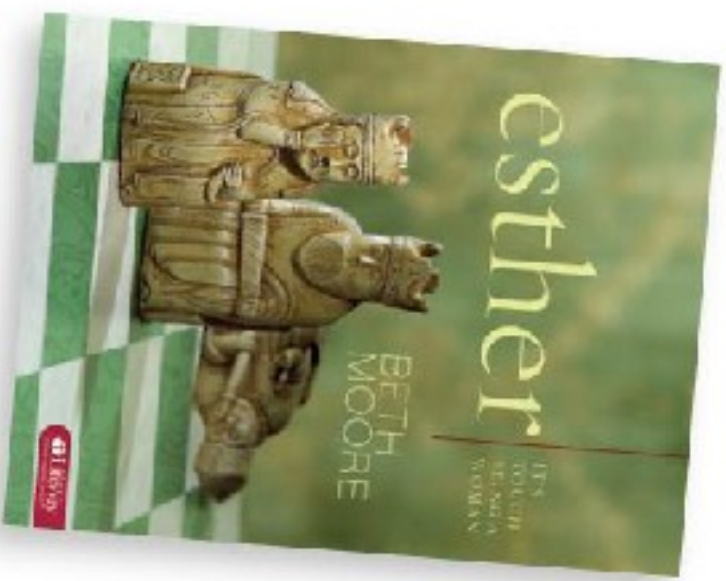
