THE ART OF RACING IN THE RAIN - by: Garth Stein

From our Interim Organist and Choir Director

Janice and I wish to thank the congregation for accepting us as interim organist and choir director here at Lord of Life Lutheran Church.

Let us introduce ourselves to you by giving you some of our background. I (James) was born and raised in New Jersey and Janice was born and raised in Indiana. (Yes, we are Yankees but with roots well suited for southern soil.) We met while attending Milligan College (a Christian Church related school) located in upper East Tennessee. Janice enrolled as a music major, already having several years experience as organist for her home church in Lynn, Indiana. I enrolled as a religion major but, as a hobby, also learned the basics of pipe organ repair and building. After our marriage, Janice has served as organist for a number of churches in the communities where we lived as well as being a stay-at-home mother for our two sons. At several of these churches I was the choir director as well. As my main occupation I joined a small pipe organ service company in Indianapolis, then later joined a company in Erie, PA that specialized in supplying materials for the pipe organ industry. After a number of years we then moved to Waynesboro, VA where I joined another company that specialized in building pipe organ consoles and pipe chests for other builders throughout the country. I specialized in designing the consoles, solid state organ control systems, and chests for that company. In our travels around the country Janice has been able to hear and play many of the great organs in this country including the organ at the Mormon Tabernacle in Salt Lake City.

After retiring from full time work we decided to follow our two sons here to Texas. One lives in South Austin and the other in Dallas. My last major organ project was installing a 36 rank organ at St Frances Episcopal Church in Temple although I still do some organ tuning and repair around central Texas. Janice has been the assistant organist at the First United Methodist Church in Round Rock.

We both have found Lord of Life Lutheran Church to be a very warm and friendly church and we look forward to serving our Lord here while you continue in your search for a permanent replacement for this position

A Food Ministry with a Servant's Heart

Since 1994, Rev Joseph Wingo and family of Monroe, GA have been committed to bringing Christ to others by providing affordable food to those in need in communities throughout the country. Through Angel Food Ministries (AFM), their principal of giving others a hand up and not a hand out is the cornerstone of their ministry.

Angel Food Ministries is a non-profit, non-denominational organization dedicated to providing food relief to communities throughout the USA. It is open to EVERYONE who wishes to participate.

A basic "Signature" box of Angel Food can be purchased for \$30. A typical Box contains several meats, vegetables, as well as shelf stable milk, eggs, and juice. (See [Sample Menu on back](#))

In our Austin area, a similar box retails anywhere from \$49 to \$55.

An average box of food weighs around 21 lbs. The weight may differ each month. A box of food assists in feeding a family of four for about one week, or a single senior citizen for almost a month.

In addition to the Signature Box, Angel Food Ministries also offers Senior Meals and Allergen Free Boxes, as well as "Special Units". The "Specials" are mostly savings on proteins and produce. (*Special #1: 6.5 lb. Assorted Meat Grill Box which typically contains steak, pork chops, Hamburger Steaks and Italian Sausage for \$23.00, Special #2 4.5 lb. Steak Combo with 2.5 lbs. of Rib eye Steaks and 2 lbs. of Sirloin Steak for \$22.00 and a Fruit and Veggie Special which typically contains 25-28 lbs. of premium fresh produce for \$22.00*)

Because Angel Foods works with only the best producers and vendors; products are high quality, "name brand" foods - never "seconds" or "day old type" products. Each month's food menu consists of both fresh and frozen items.

AFM produces a monthly menu to inform customers of what food items will be available a full month in advance. (See [October Menu on Back](#))

There is no limit on the number or types of boxes an individual or family may purchase.

There are NO applications or qualifications, anyone and EVERYONE CAN PARTICIPATE. Angel Food Ministries also participates in the U.S. Food Stamp Program, using the Off-Line Food stamp Voucher system. This ensures that the needy in your area are getting the maximum value for their grocery dollar, usually resulting in their receiving twice the amount of quality foods for their "food stamp dollar".

Food sales and distribution would be handled at our LOLLC campus. Lord of Life would begin by PARTNERING with Hill Country Nazarene Church who has been a Host Site for over three years. LOLLC would get the boxes on "Distribution Saturday" from them and/or "Drop Site" to bring to our campus for delivery.

Lord of Life has filled out a partner application online at www.angelfoodministries.com

Orders and payments would be collected at LOLLC during the first part of each month. Then given to Hill Country Nazarene which enters them with Angel Food's main office

The next week, called "Distribution Week," Angel Food Ministries begins loading the trucks that are scheduled to arrive at the host sites on what we call "Distribution Saturday" ... usually the 4th Saturday of the month.

LOLLC will need an AFM Director and "Distribution Saturday" volunteers – one for every 10-12 units distributed. On distribution day, church volunteers (members/youth/cub scouts) come together to perform duties ranging from setting up tables, filling boxes of food or assisting disabled or elderly customers by carrying their boxes to their cars.

Yes, this definitely is an Outreach Ministry. Churches and organizations across the United States are able to reach out in a greater way through their participation with Angel Food Ministries. As a host church, we can provide a practical, non-threatening, yet life giving, way for even our most timid church members to touch others as they return to the church each month to receive their food. They will often return bringing friends and relatives, and the members of our church will be able to touch the visitors with the compassion of Jesus in a very real, genuine way.

Host site churches become known in their local areas because of their "heart" for others. Their congregation becomes transformed as their members' work together as a compassionate army of inspired and motivated workers. Financial strain is lifted. Lives are touched. **Give a box to someone in need.**

Are we interested in being part of this much-needed ministry? The Evangelism Committee is looking for at least two people who feel called to lead this ministry. One Saturday a month ...

The sooner we can get this up and running, the better. There is such a need for this type of program in today's economic downturn. **Please prayerfully consider being part of this program.** Contact Pastor Dave, Glenace Klinker, or Lisa Kincart if you feel called to be a leader in this ministry.
