The Color of Wine



Martin Luther says that a sacrament must meet three criteria. 1. It must offer forgiveness of sins. 2. It was instituted – begun and directed – by Jesus. 3. It must use earthly elements.

The earthly elements for Communion are bread and wine. The color of wine should be one of two colors. Red, which we have been using, for the color of the blood of Jesus. Amber, or golden, colored wine is also liturgically acceptable. The color symbolizes the resurrection of Jesus.

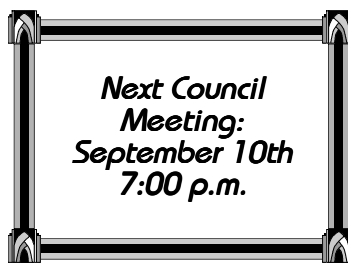
The Altar Guild has decided to go with amber (golden) color because it is more practical. Amber wine doesn't stain like red wine does.

Beginning September 6, we will be using amber colored wine for Communion. Grape juice will remain red. That will also make the distinction between the wine and the grape juice.

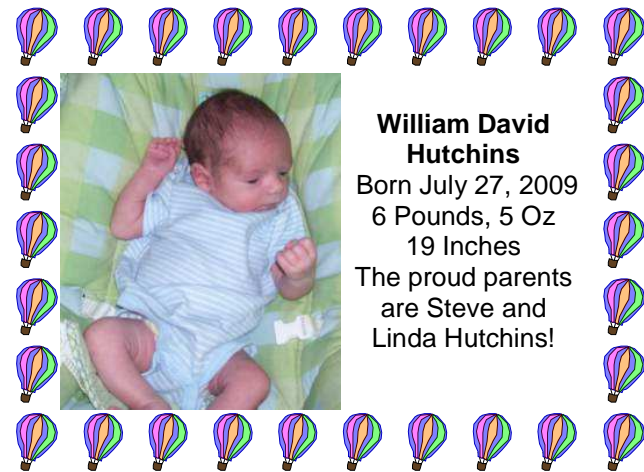

## Treasurer's Report

Dear Friends in Christ;

I have not published a financial report for several months and realized that I needed to do that. We were very blessed to start the year with a 40,000.00 bank balance due to the gracious giving of our members and friends in the month of December. We have been using that balance for the last seven months and it is drawing down to serious state.

We have a savings and can use some of that money but we would rather not do that in order to use it for starting new facility plans for the future. However this may not be possible if we continue in the same giving path. We knew going into the year that we had a deficit budget but instead of the \$23,500.00 amount we really had a 34,500.00 deficit for we did not get the amount of pledges as indicated in the budget.

So I am taking this opportunity to make everyone aware what our status is as we ask for your prayers and help in taking care of the last 4 months of our year.

We continue to make plans with the MIF people to adjust our payment plan for the note payment of \$9,932.00 but we need to present a financial plan to do that and we need to finalize that very soon.

So we ask for your prayers and help in continuing the ministry, pay for repairs and upkeep to our facility and pay our ongoing bills in the months till the end of the year.

With God's help and with all of our members we can do this.
